Home/school/community partnership

We welcome and value our partnership with parents and greatly appreciate parent support. We hope that together we can support our children in making our school a successful place for all.

Parents are always welcome and there are many opportunities for parents and carers to help and participate in school life in addition to taking part in our special events. Classes lead assembly worship every half term and parents are invited to celebrate with us. Parents are also invited to attend end of term Celebration Assemblies.

The Headteacher's monthly newsletter keeps you up to date with school life. Regular class newsletters and curriculum overviews provide information and home learning enables you to be involved in the children's development. There are also a number of informal and formal meetings throughout the school year to discuss your child's progress with their class teacher.

The school plays an important part in community life and we are fortunate in having an enthusiastic local community who support the school. Our local Clergy at St Mary's in Princes Risborough are also committed to supporting and being involved in school life.

Positive Behaviour

Our school works hard to develop behaviour through mutual respect and trust between pupils, and between pupils and staff. We believe that pupils, staff and parents should work together with high expectations and that all have rights and responsibilities within our school.

Pupils are taught to have a sense of pride in themselves, in their school, and in their environment. Shared clear expectations are underpinned by a calm and purposeful atmosphere that supports children to make decisions about their behaviour.

A whole school reward system is used consistently and fairly throughout the day ensuring pupils are clear of the school's expectations. Our children demonstrate outstanding engagement and behaviour and understand that this is a learning focussed environment. They know who to ask for help and feel safe during the school day.

We work with parents to inform them of any notable behaviours and give support when needed. Home school diaries, behaviour charts, telephone calls and discussions are used to keep parents up to date. We welcome your support in encouraging positive behaviour from all our children.

Teaching and Learning

At Longwick there is a strong emphasis on teaching and learning and regular monitoring of standards. We have a team of highly trained staff who are dedicated to ensuring that our children make the very best of themselves during their time with us. Teachers and teaching assistants know the pupils very well and plan the curriculum to ensure that our children's needs are met. Our curriculum is broad, balanced and is matched to our pupils needs. It is cross-curricular where pupils focus on developing key skills in reading, writing and mathematics. Curriculum overviews are shared at the beginning of every half term with parents and pupils. Our curriculum is also enhanced through a range of day visits and residential visits in Year 4 and 6.

For children with further needs the support needed may be academic or social, cultural or emotional. We have put in place a number of systems to help this inclusive view of education as well as challenging more able pupils through differentiation.
