Key Stage 1

- A broad and balanced curriculum, providing 'challenge and intrigue' through a range of exciting and engaging learning activities in and out of the classroom.
- Developing core literacy, phonic and numeracy skills, fostering enjoyment, perseverance and determination to succeed.
- Developing and fostering a positive attitude towards learning, valuing pupils contributions whilst meeting their individual needs, enabling them to become the best that they can be.









Key Stage 2

- The educational journey continues, further developing skill across the curriculum.
- Strong focus on English and Maths.
- Greater emphasis on formal efficient methods of calculation, applying them to problem solving and reasoning activities.
- English lessons focus on precise sentence structure and grammatical features, appreciating and understanding a wide range of literature both classic and modern.

- Purposeful links are made across all curriculum areas, with homework activities to embed learning.
- Delivering the curriculum through formal direct teaching strategies, independent learning opportunities and group participation activities, monitoring progress as we go.
- Expectations of children are high, supported by strong teaching methods, focussed assessment, support and extension activities.
